My SmartForce - Web-based Training

# 3. Project overview:

In response to students' needs for flexible learning options and facilitate the integration of technology into the traditional classroom and distance learning courses, we chose My Blackboard web-based training system. My Blackboard offers students a just-in-time approach to IT, Business and Interpersonal skills learning. My SmartForce is available 24/7 using an Internet connection, from on or off campus.

Faculty will be able to integrate My SmartForce into their courses, giving students an additional learning tool to either reinforce skills taught during class, go over IT skills that may be required to take the course, or as an additional learning tool for online and traditional courses. In addition, the licensing includes staff members, which offers IT training for those that don't have time to come to workshops.

Faculty that choose to integrate My SmartForce into their courses, will have the option to choose from 320 learning modules specific to their disciplines and create their own Learning Paths. Students can be added to these custom Learning Paths and faculty will have the ability to track their progress in a detailed report.
