Course Management Software Work Group

A number of campuses are currently working on strategies to deploy or update Course Management Software. It is proposed that a work group should be brought together at this time to:

Survey current use of Course Management Software across UNC (DPI, NCCCS?) Help to determine what type of system-wide opportunities may be of interest (not an imposed solution but common options for hosting, service providers/consulting, license agreements, etc).

Develop evaluation criteria and assist campuses that are looking to make decisions in this area.

Develop common testing processes and requirements sheets (sample courses/content, functional requirement lists, etc) and criteria to apply to evaluation of course management systems.

Investigate interest in and opportunities for collaborative approaches to course management systems, and identify technical issues associated with, common solutions/licenses, common hosting, authentication, back-end connectivity (SIS, etc).

NOTE: We need to discuss this carefully. It is critical that any efforts within the Collaborative are a part of the general efforts taking place on each campus. This work may also need to coordinated with the Alliance (?)

Flashlight, TLT roundtables

Based on my assessment re: funding availability, I propose to offer all campuses the opportunity to participate in the Flashlight and TLT roundtables by providing a 2-3 year licenses (paid by the Collaborative with current year funds). Campus would need to identify an individual to coordinate these initiatives. Collaborative would have no direct involvement at this time other than facilitating by purchasing the licenses.

Targeted Projects for FY2000 (all are likely to involve some degree of collaboration/communications with NCCCS and DPI):

1 Evaluation and Assessment.

Survey of emerging efforts and best practices associated with the evaluation of use of technology for teaching and learning, evaluation tools and benchmarks, etc. Develop community of interest across UNC (by topic, by discipline.)

Develop/recommend tools and evaluation standards associated with learning effectiveness of on-line courses/materials/activities.

2. Faculty Development.

Survey of current practices and campus strategies (UNC and beyond).

Survey of basic technology skills assessment tools and practices, and proposal for common assessment tool.

Evaluate and recommend basic skills on-time training strategies (online courses, self-paced options, outsourced options, workshops, mentor programs, train-the-trainer, collaborative training, etc..)

3. Assistive Technologies

Survey of current practices and campus strategies (UNC and beyond). Build on work of IDEA station initiative to establish common standards to support campus planning and decision-making, common procurement opportunities, etc.

Develop and publish resources and best practices associated with integration of assistive technologies into online and classroom learning. Recommend a systemwide structure for continued services in this area.

4. Course Management Systems

Survey current use of Course Management Software across UNC (DPI, NCCCS?)

Help to determine what type of system-wide opportunities may be of interest (not an imposed solution but common options for hosting, service providers/consulting, license agreements, etc).

Develop evaluation criteria and assist campuses that are looking to make decisions in this area.

Develop common testing processes and requirements sheets (sample courses/content, functional requirement lists, etc) and criteria to apply to evaluation of course management systems.

Investigate interest in and opportunities for collaborative approaches to course management systems, and identify technical issues associated with, common solutions/licenses, common hosting, authentication, back-end connectivity (SIS, etc).
